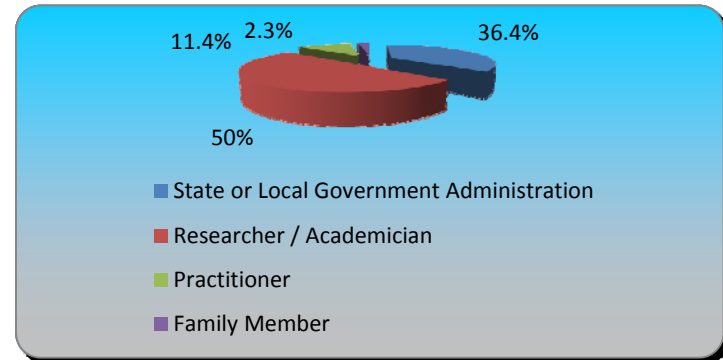

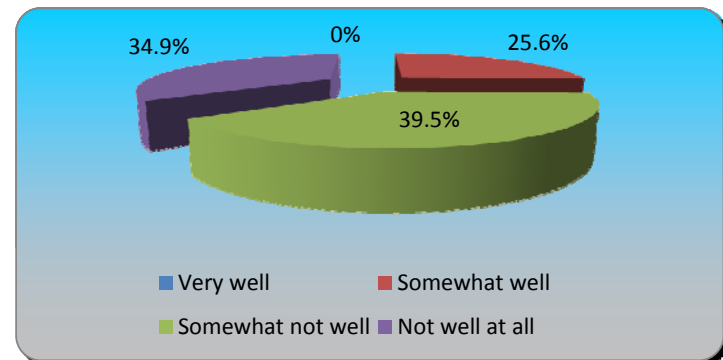

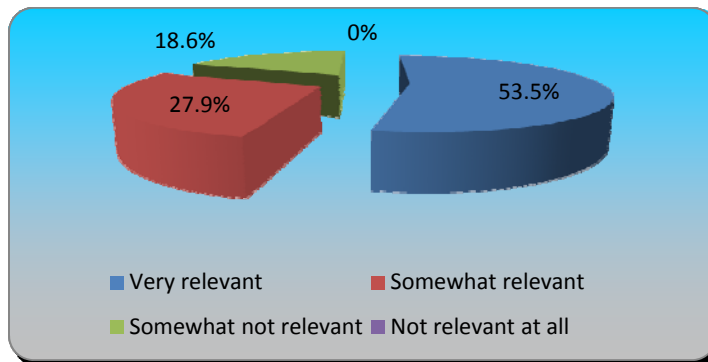


<u>2.) How well do you think government decision makers and practitioners currently use research information?</u>	<u>Responses</u>

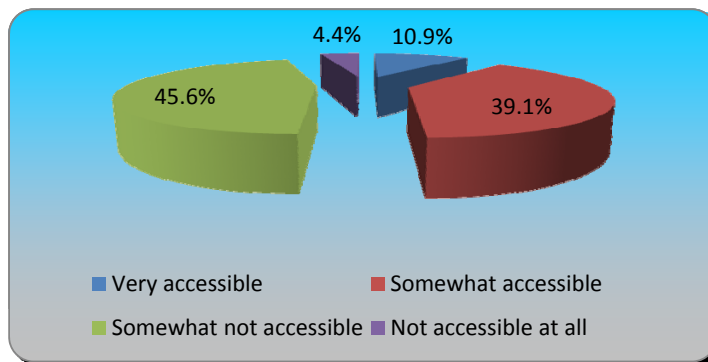
3.) How relevant do you think current research is to key policy and practice decisions?

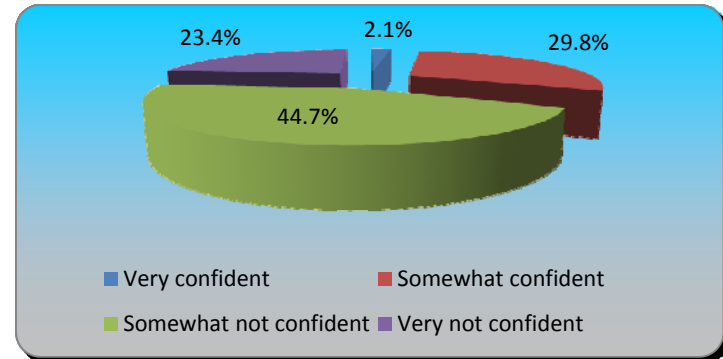
4.) How accessible do you believe current research is to government decision makers and practitioners?

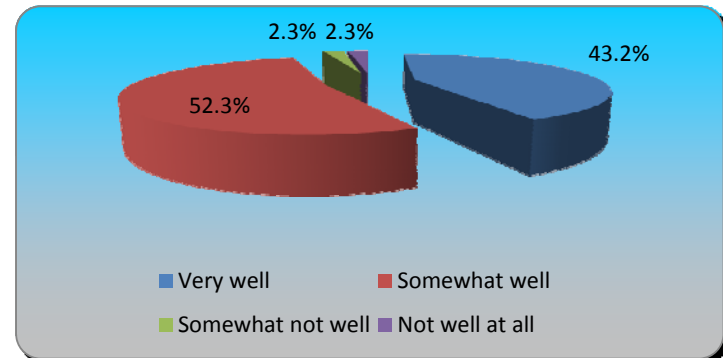
5.) How confident are you that evidence-based practices will be effectively implemented statewide in Nebraska?

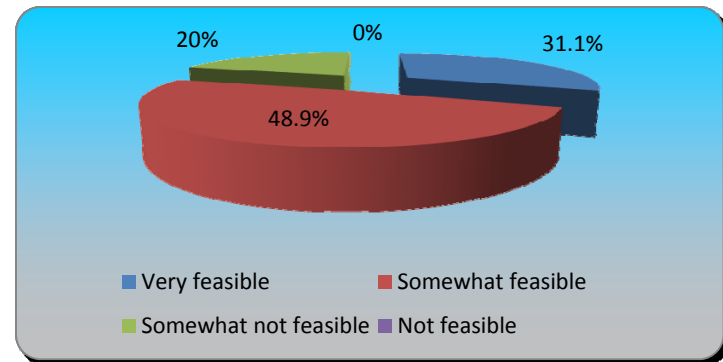
6.) How well do you understand the concepts of evidence-based practices?
